
#### **Calendar for June:**

### **Bulletin Board**

- 1) As reported at the Annual Meeting, the Fellowship is ending our fiscal year well in the black primarily due to some committees not spending their budgeted amount as well as many members giving more than they initially pledged.
- 2) At the last meeting, the UUFL Board approved an essentially balanced budget for the 2024-2025 fiscal year, which was presented at our Annual meeting. The budget takes into account the rising costs of several items (utilities, QuickBooks, etc.) and redistributes much of the minister's salary to more outside speakers, enhanced music, and a potential search committee.
- 3) Barbara Bogart and Dan Elliott have stepped up to be our delegates at the UUA General Assembly June 20–23rd. This is the meeting that will take the final vote on the proposed major revision of Article II. If you have strong opinions on this matter, please share them with our delegates.
